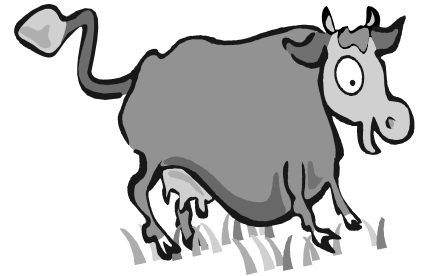

EXHIBITORS & COMPETITORS GENERAL RULES

- Closing times for entries will be strictly observed and no late entries will be accepted.
- Exhibitors & competitors in all sections compete entirely at their own risk. The society is not responsible for any injury, damage or loss sustained by an exhibitor or competitor.
- The judge's decision in all classes shall be final. No prize money will be posted. All prize money unclaimed at the completion of the show will be paid back into Society funds.
- No exhibit can be entered in two distinct classes except in Livestock sections
- The Society reserves the right to refuse to admit any exhibit into the grounds or pavilion if there is reason to suspect it is either diseased or dangerous or to remove any such exhibit from the exhibition. In cases of infectious disease being spread by a violation of this rule exhibitors may be held liable for any loss that may result from this act.
- The Society reserved the right to remove any person from the grounds or pavilion whom they consider is guilty of objectionable conduct.
- Whilst every effort will be made to follow the program the stewards reserve the right to substitute or alter any event if considered necessary.
- In awarding the Championship the Judge will be required to select the next entry in order of merit to be called the Reserve, which shall take the place of Champion in the event of the latter being disqualified for any cause.
- All exhibitors will pay gate admission fees.
- No entry fee is required for Champion prizes.
- Age of all horses to be computed from the 1st August.
- All exhibits must be presented in show condition and under proper control at all times.
- All dogs brought into grounds must be on leash and will be the responsibility of the owner.
- Stallions will not be allowed to compete with Geldings and Mares except in classes specified.
- No Exhibitor or other person than the steward will be allowed in that section of ground during judging. Attendants usually in charge of stock may hold no communication with the judge except through the steward. Any person so offending will be liable to forfeit their claim to any prize and it shall be the duty of the stewards to prevent any person interfering with the judge and if necessary remove such offenders from the grounds.
- The committee will take all reasonable care for the safety of exhibits, but the Society will not be held for any accident or loss that may occur to, from or by an exhibit during the show. A condition of entry is that each exhibitor holds the Society blameless and indemnifies it against legal proceedings arising from such accident or loss.
- Exhibitors shall be under the direction of the Stewards and if so required arrange their exhibits and no exhibit must afterwards be removed without the sanction of the Steward under penalty of being removed from the ground or pavilion and the forfeiture of any prize which may have been awarded to it.
- No animal exhibit shall be decorated with any previous award while being judged.
- Competitors in ring events will be called twice over the Public Address System prior to the holding of the event in which they are interested. If they do not appear the event will proceed in the absence.
- No stallion shall be paraded without a bit in his mouth, or stallion halter. Stallions may not be ridden or led by a person under 17 years of age.
- The ring events shall be in the hands of the Ring Master and in his/her opinion if the condition of the ground makes it dangerous to compete he/she shall convene a meeting with the executive committee and a majority decision shall be final. Entry fees paid by competitors for events canceled shall be refunded. The committee accepts no responsibility to indemnify competitors for events canceled under such circumstances.
- The Grand Parade will be held following the completion of cattle judging. All ring and cattle exhibitors are expected to parade, negligence to do so may render the owner liable to forfeit claims of any prizes won by that exhibit.
- If less than 3 entries in any event only first prize will be paid.
- In all registered classes registration papers must be produced upon the request of the Steward. Non compliance with this will render the owner liable to forfeit his/her claim to any prizes won in classes in which these papers are required.
- A \$25 fee must accompany all protests, in the event of the committee upholding the protest the fee will be refunded.

PAVILION SECTION

Pavilion Regulations

1. Judges may withhold any prize if they are of the opinion that there is not sufficient merit to justify an award.
2. While the committee will take every possible precaution to ensure the safety of articles for exhibit, they wish it to be understood that the owner themselves must take the risks of exhibiting them and should any article be lost or damaged the committee will not be held responsible.
3. Entries will be taken in the pavilion from 10 am to 4 pm **Saturday, 29th April, 2017** and the pavilion will be opened to the **Public at 10.30 am on Sunday, 30th April, 2017.**
4. **NO ENTRY/EXHIBIT CAN BE REMOVED BEFORE 4:00 PM ON SUNDAY 30th April, 2017. PLEASE ORGANIZE SOMEONE TO COLLECT YOUR ITEMS IF YOU CANNOT CLAIM THEM YOURSELF.**
5. Stewards of each section must be present when you collect your articles.
6. The Stewards duties will end 4.30pm Sunday, 30th April, 2017. Exhibitors will be responsible for their own exhibit after this time. ANY UNCOLLECTED ITEM BECOMES SHOW PROPERTY
7. Entries that have previously won a prize in our pavilion will not be accepted. With the exception of entries in SECTION D POTTED PLANTS.
8. No exhibit shall be shown in two classes.
9. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, all produce to be the production of the person exhibiting and all manufactures the work of the exhibitor.
10. 1st and 2nd Ribbons only unless more than (5) entries or judges feel they need to award a 3rd placing.
11. Trophies will be awarded for the best exhibit in each section.
12. Any items of COOKING/PRESERVES and VEGETABLES can be donated to the show society for sale at the end of the show—please advise your steward when you enter. This is optional.
13. The judges or committee have the right to reject any entry considered unsuitable/unacceptable.
14. Exhibitors are to sign exhibits in and out of the pavilion through the pavilion secretary (at the front door)

The original is to be attached to the National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form accompanying the cattle, if applicable. A duplicate remains with the vendor; it is recommended the vendor retains a copy of this declaration for seven (7) years.

QUESTION 3: PESTIVIRUS TESTING

Persistently infected animals can be detected by conducting a pestivirus antigen test. This test only needs to be conducted once in an animal's life. Cattle that test positive in most cases are persistently infected animals. Contact your veterinarian for assistance in understanding the test results or go to www.bvdaustralia.com.au.

QUESTIONS 4 & 5 – ENZOOTIC BOVINE LEUCOSIS (EBL)

All cattle entering Tasmania must meet at least **ONE** of the following criteria:

- Cattle have been tested for Enzootic Bovine Leucosis with the ELISA test within 42 days before shipment with negative results and evidence supplied via an attached laboratory report. If samples were pooled, no more than 10 sera or 30 milk samples were combined in each pool. Unweaned calves less than 12-weeks-of-age transported with their dam do not require testing for EBL; **OR**
- Dairy cattle from a registered dairy herd must be accredited as Monitored Negative (MN) or better, according to the national guidelines for Enzootic Bovine Leucosis Control; **OR**
- Beef or beef-cross breeds must come from herds in Victoria, South Australia, Western Australia (excluding the cattle tick infested area), New South Wales (excluding North Coast Livestock Health and Pest Authority District), or Queensland (excluding the cattle tick infested area). The herd of origin must have been in existence for at least three (3) years with no evidence of Enzootic Bovine Leucosis infection in the last three (3) years.

QUESTIONS 6, 7 & 8: JOHNE'S DISEASE BEEF CATTLE

Note: JD is a notifiable disease, so it is important to answer these questions.

Occurrence of JD refers to clinical disease in the herd or on the property.

The Johne's Beef Assurance Score (J-BAS) is a tool developed for JD risk profiling. Details are available on the Animal Health Australia website under JD in cattle. The J-BAS is an initial guide and purchasers should ask for more information about JD in the origin herd (see JD in Cattle Biosecurity Checklist on the AHA website under JD in cattle). Transitional arrangements are in place until 30 June 2017. All plans should include the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Plan Checklist.

Check test – testing of 50 adult animals in the herd (or all eligible animals in a herd if less than 50 adult animals) biased to increase the probability of detecting infection, tested by ELISA, (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR.

Sample test - screening of the adult herd or a large representative sample of the adult herd by an approved test (ELISA, (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR).

EXHIBITORS & COMPETITORS GENERAL RULES

1. Closing times for entries will be strictly observed and no late entries will be accepted.
2. Exhibitors & competitors in all sections compete entirely at their own risk. The society is not responsible for any injury, damage or loss sustained by an exhibitor or competitor.
3. The judge's decision in all classes shall be final. No prize money will be posted. All prize money unclaimed at the completion of the show will be paid back into Society funds.
4. No exhibit can be entered in two distinct classes except in Livestock sections
5. The Society reserves the right to refuse to admit any exhibit into the grounds or pavilion if there is reason to suspect it is either diseased or dangerous or to remove any such exhibit from the exhibition. In cases of infectious disease being spread by a violation of this rule exhibitors may be held liable for any loss that may result from this act.
6. The Society reserved the right to remove any person from the grounds or pavilion whom they consider is guilty of objectionable conduct.
7. Whilst every effort will be made to follow the program the stewards reserve the right to substitute or alter any event if considered necessary.
8. In awarding the Championship the Judge will be required to select the next entry in order of merit to be called the Reserve, which shall take the place of Champion in the event of the latter being disqualified for any cause.
9. **All exhibitors will pay gate admission fees.**
10. No entry fee is required for Champion prizes.
11. Age of all horses to be computed from the 1st August.
12. All exhibits must be presented in show condition and under proper control at all times.
13. All dogs brought into grounds must be on leash and will be the responsibility of the owner.
14. Stallions will not be allowed to compete with Geldings and Mares except in classes specified.
15. **No Exhibitor or other person than the steward will be allowed in that section of ground during judging. Attendants usually in charge of stock may hold no communication with the judge except through the steward. Any person so offending will be liable to forfeit their claim to any prize and it shall be the duty of the stewards to prevent any person interfering with the judge and if necessary remove such offenders from the grounds.**
16. The committee will take all reasonable care for the safety of exhibits, but the Society will not be held for any accident or loss that may occur to, from or by an exhibit during the show. A condition of entry is that each exhibitor holds the Society blameless and indemnifies it against legal proceedings arising from such accident or loss.

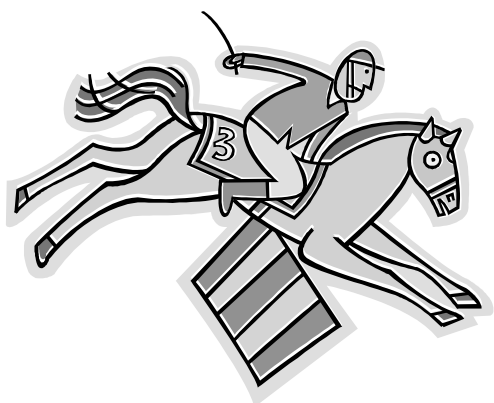

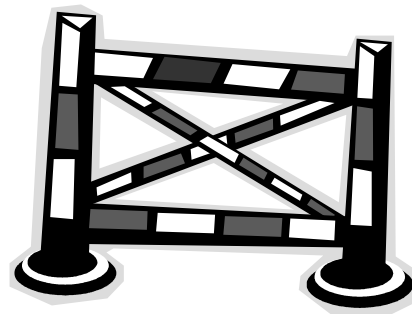
